- Having personal income was associated with voluntary admission.
- Suicide risk at admission was associated with voluntariness.
- Activation, resistance and positive symptoms were associated with involuntariness.
- Aggression in the first 24 hours of admission was associated with involuntariness.
- Data support involuntary hospitalization for patients with severe mental illness.
