

Abstract

We report a case of a 20-month-old girl with atypical presentation of a fairy common condition. She presented with acute onset of fever, seizures and hemiparesis. Her cerebrospinal fluid (CSF) showed total nucleated cells 10/mm³ with lymphocyte dominance. Herpes simplex virus (HSV) polymerase chain reaction (PCR) result was negative.
