Highlights

- This paper tests the predict power of self-assessed risk attitudes for choices in a risk experiment.
- The analysis is based on a field study with more than 200 non-student subjects.
- Results show that the correlation between self-assessed risk attitudes and experimental choices is low and insignificant.
