

Highlights

- Prevalence of depression symptoms was 29.5% (95%Cl 27.9-31.1%), 58.0% (95%Cl 54.5-61.4%) and 73.6% (95%Cl 70.4-76.8%) in subjects with BADL scores of 0, 1 and ≥2, respectively.
- Prevalence of depression symptoms was 27.0% (95%Cl 25.3-28.7%), 34.2% (95%Cl 30.0-38.4%) and 43.8% (95%Cl 39.1-48.5%) in non-disabled subjects with spouse BADL scores of 0, 1 and ≥2, respectively.
- ADL disabilities were associated with increased risk of both personal and spouse depression symptoms in middle-aged and older Chinese adults.
- There might be a threshold in the severity of disability to trigger the development of depression symptoms.
