

Highlights

- There are etiological and treatment differences between adult and adolescent depression
- We systematically compared adolescent and adult major depression symptom profiles
- Appetite/weight change, energy loss and insomnia were common in adolescents
- Loss of interest/anhedonia and concentration problems were more common in adults
- Results were similar for Major Depressive Disorder and depressive symptom count
