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Prenatal and postnatal maternal depression and infant hospitalization and mortality in the first year of life: a systematic review and meta-analysis

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
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Highlights:

- Children of mothers with postnatal depressive symptoms or depression had an increased risk of death in the first year of life.
- Children of mothers with prenatal and postnatal depressive symptoms or depression had a higher risk of hospitalization than those whose mothers did not have the disorder during prenatal and/or postnatal periods.
- As a limitation, different instrument and cut points were used to evaluate maternal depressive symptoms or depression.
- Other limitation one study do not clearly explain the dichotomization process of exposure since the authors used the ICD-9-CM codes.

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
