Highlights:

- Girls report more depressive symptoms than boys
- Parents report fewer depressive symptoms than the offspring itself
- Depressive symptoms in children and adolescents do not increase with increasing age
- Cognitive symptoms seem to be the best predictors of high depression scores
- The risk of self-selection and non-response bias in voluntary participation is high
