### Highlights

- Municipalities benefited by the FUNDEF redistribution increased teacher salary.
- Municipalities harmed by the redistribution increased expenses by hiring teachers.
- The amount transferred led to an increase in teachers and a decrease in salaries.
- The net value was more important to salary levels than the absolute value.
- Results suggest that bargaining power is an important factor in hiring decisions.
