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Stigma and Discrimination in Individuals with First Episode
Psychosis; one year after first contact with psychiatric services

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Highlights:

- Three quarters of the participants reported at least one experience of discrimination.
- Being female was associated with higher unfair treatment, stopping-self and higher positive treatment scores.
- Higher baseline PANSS total score was associated with lower positive treatment.
- Higher 3 month PANSS total score was associated with higher stopping self-scores.
- Those with higher 3 and 12 month PANSS total score had lower overcoming stigma scores.
- Higher GAF score at 12 months was associated with higher overcoming stigma scores.
- Lower PHQ 9 scores were correlated with overcoming stigma.

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
