

Stress-full life events and multiple sclerosis: A population-based incident case-control study

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## Highlights

- Key finding 1: Despite the current general belief, we could not demonstrate a statistically significant association between the total stressful life events during the preceding 3 years and MS risk.
- Key finding 2: We found evidence confirming the possible role of some individual stressful life events i.e. divorce and homeless periods as potential risk factors for MS while getting married as protective factor for MS.
- These associations were all adjusted for age, gender, physical activity, tobacco smoking, and alcohol drinking
