Highlights

- We evaluate the effect of a Swedish payroll tax reduction for young workers
- We find small overall effects on employment and wages, also in the long run
- Employment response is strongest for the very youngest workers
- We find no effect on hours worked
- Lower payroll taxes had no impact on immigrants and previously unemployed
