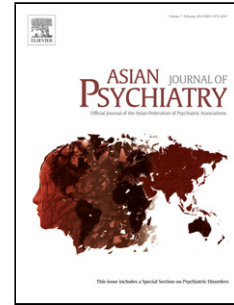


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Title: High doses of Baclofen as suicide attempt in patients with alcohol use disorders - a serious concern

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- Baclofen is often prescribed off-label in ADS patients who fail approved drugs.
- Lack of proper recommendations on dosage has important safety implications.
- Two patients reported had serious complications after acute self-inflicted overdose.
- This includes CNS suppression, cardiac conduction and autonomic disturbances.
- Benefit/risk should be assessed in all patients with co-morbid psychiatric disorder.

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
