Abstract

We assessed transgenerational effects of maternal traumatic exposure, posttraumatic stress

symptoms and posttraumatic stress disorder on trauma-related symptoms in Cambodian

offspring born after the genocidal Khmer Rouge Regime. We conducted a randomized cross-

sectional study. N = 378 mothers from 4 provinces of the country and one of each of their

grown-up children were interviewed. Lifetime traumatic exposure was determined using a

context-adapted event list. Present posttraumatic stress symptoms and a potential

posttraumatic stress disorder were assessed using the civilian version of the Posttraumatic

Stress Disorder Checklist. We found no indication of transgenerational effects that were

directly related to maternal traumatic exposure, posttraumatic stress symptoms or

posttraumatic stress disorder. Instead, a gender-specific moderating effect was found.
