## Background

Depression is a significant contributor of global disease burden. Previous studies have revealed cross-cultural and gender differences in the presentation of depressive symptoms. Using the Center for Epidemiologic Studies-Depression Scale (CES-D), the present study examined differences in self-reported somatic symptoms, negative affective, and anhedonia symptoms of depression among Egyptian and Canadian university students.
