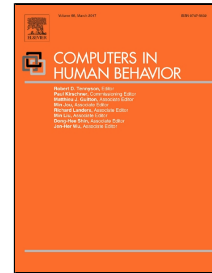

Highlights

The absence of explicit privacy rules between parties leads to privacy violations.
Secrets were prematurely announced, violating others' expectations of disclosure.
Privacy breaches online have lasting implications for on and offline relationships.
Privacy rules were revisited, readjusted, and renegotiated after a violation.
The use of explicit privacy rules would have prevented many privacy violations.
