

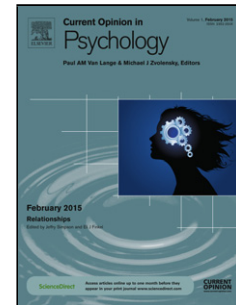

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Fathers, Fathering and Child Psychopathology

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## Highlights

- *Father involvement can significantly influence children's developmental outcomes*
- *Increased paternal sensitivity and engagement are associated with reduced child psychopathology*
- *Secure father-child attachment independently predicts decreased adverse child outcomes*
- *Parenting programmes generally do not successfully engage fathers*
- *Paternal engagement in interventions can improve beneficial child outcomes*

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
