Highlights

- Severe health anxiety is associated with negative illness perceptions.
- Mothers' health anxiety also involves health-related worries towards their child.
- Mothers with health anxiety are less satisfied with their child's doctor visits.
- Health anxiety by proxy may be an overlooked treatment target in mothers.
