

- We find two balancing conditions BC for the sustainability of cultural heterogeneity
- BC relate to degree distribution and vertical transmission rate distribution.
- Paternalistic motivations ensure the preservation of cultural heterogeneity
- Homophily has the opposite effect
- Paternalism is always stronger than homophily.
