Highlights

- Permanent supportive housing is negatively associated with homeless counts.
- Causal effects are identified on the basis of significantly lagged funding decisions.
- The impact of permanent supportive housing on homelessness is negative but modest.
- Expanded permanent supportive housing does not explain recent homelessness decline.
