Highlights

- Endogenous remittances are introduced in a two-small open economies model with emphasis on fiscal policy.
- Economy is more resilient to income shocks in an economy with cross-border labor mobility.
- Tax on consumption and government purchases have no long-run effect on migration.
- A tax on remittances can be welfare improving as it can reduce over-migration.
