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An energy-like indicator to assess opinion resilience

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
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Highlights

- We use the bounded-confidence model, with fixed uncertainties and extremists, for investigating how the population's opinion is resilient to the arrival of a new group
- The resilience of the population only depends on the equivalent energy of the group arrival, this latter being called tipping energy.
- The higher the uncertainty of the moderate agents, the higher the resilience of their moderate mean opinion to the arrival of a new group.
- The single extreme cluster emerges in the case of a null tipping energy

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
