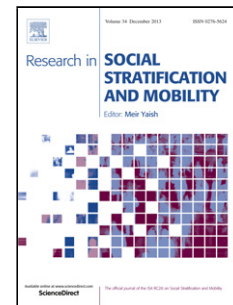

Highlights

- Paper estimates ‘cost of immigration’ among four major ethnic groups in the US.
- ‘Cost of immigration’ vis a vis the most advantaged group in the U.S.
- ‘Cost of immigration’ net of ethnicity.
- ‘Economic costs’ are much smaller in the second generation than in the first one.
- Economic disadvantage is least pronounced among white immigrants.
