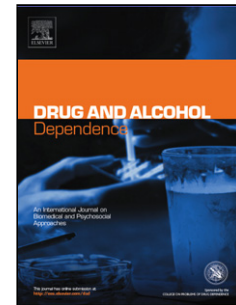

Highlights

- We study predictors of drinking despite health problems in those with liver disease.
- We use a nationally representative sample of individuals with liver disease.
- Drug use and personality disorders predict drinking despite health problems.
- A family history of alcohol problems predicts drinking despite health problems.
- Liver disease patients with some psychiatric comorbidities may drink despite risks.
