

Highlights

- Cat elimination sequences are more complex than previously thought, including as many as 39 different behaviors
- A relatively brief elimination sequence may be indicative of a more positive litter box experience
- Cats continue to use a box (and not eliminate outside the box) even when their behavior is indicative of frustration
- Provision of a suitable litter box environment promotes optimal wellbeing and potentially urinary tract health in cats

Abstract

Few studies have sought to describe cat elimination behavior in detail and much of the information presently available focuses on factors that potentially cause cats to reject a litter box. Thus, the ethograms published in the current veterinary and scientific literature largely
