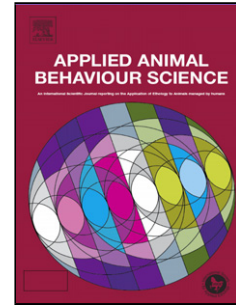

Highlights

- Social referencing in pet dogs was evidenced when facing an unknown human
- We investigated if this phenomenon exists in shelter dogs
- Shelter dogs did not behave differently according to their caregivers' reaction
- Unlike pet dogs, shelter dogs do not present social referencing with their handler
- Shelter dogs' lack of interactions with humans impairs social referencing
