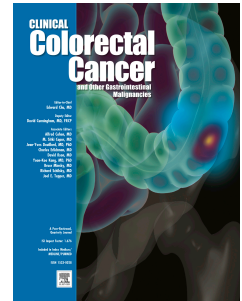

Micro-abstract

Developments in mutation analysis have added to the complexity of treatment selection. A mixed-methods study, with a sample of 358 oncologists from seven countries, aimed to identify international clinical practice challenges regarding CRC treatment. Findings indicate that treatment selection is hindered by 6 substantive challenges, which have the potential to inform the development of interventions to improve practice.
