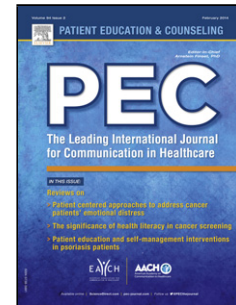

**A significant minority of patients did not desire or objected to doctor enquiry.**

Patients and doctors **do not always agree on** what spiritual discussion entails.
