Highlights:

- First study to investigate public attitudes towards psychiatrists in Hanoi, Vietnam
- Gender and religious beliefs significantly influence public attitudes towards psychiatrists
- Men reported significantly more negative attitudes towards psychiatrists
- Negative perceptions may reflect a diminished use of psychiatric services by men
- Destigmatisation campaigns should be sensitive to gender and religious beliefs
