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**QUALITY OF LIFE IN CHILDREN AND ADOLESCENTS WITH SYMPTOMS OR DIAGNOSIS OF
CONDUCT DISORDER OR OPPOSITIONAL DEFIANT DISORDER**

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ABSTRACT

Background: The construct of Quality of Life (QoL) is a multidimensional concept: it expresses the personal experience of illness into a measurable outcome, as it gives more information about the daily functioning and the success of treatment, than only counting the existing symptoms. Oppositional defiant disorder (ODD) and conduct disorder (CD) are two of the most often diagnosed problems at youth mental health services.

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
