Highlights

- Little is known about relationship between identity styles and addiction vulnerability in the university students.
- The addiction vulnerability can be influenced by student's backgrounds such as accommodation and acceptance quota.
- The present study showed that there is positive relationship between diffuse-avoidant style and addiction vulnerability and inverse relationship normative and commitment styles and the studied outcome.
