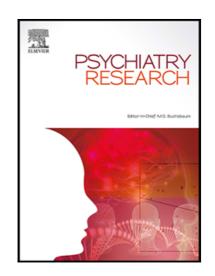

- There are no differences in mentalisation in violent and nonviolent schizophrenics.
- Worse mentaliation is related to schizophrenia but not violence in this illness.
- Violence in schizophrenics and controls has different predictors.
