

- Childhood maltreatment is associated with problematic social media use.
- Avoidant attachment was associated with less problematic use.
- Anxious attachment was associated with more problematic use.
- Avoidant attachment and depression in series accounted for part of the relationship.
- Anxious attachment and depressive symptoms in series fully mediated the relationship.
