Highlights

- Patients showed impaired cognition on baseline compared to healthy controls.
- Cognitive change over 6 years is mostly of comparable magnitude in the two groups.
- Patients showed a larger improvement in reasoning/ problem solving than controls.
- Patients showed less improvement in working memory than controls.
- 45.5 % of the patients were fully recovered by 6-year follow-up.
