Highlights

- a conceptually unexplored behavior where adolescents report deliberately using sex as a means of self-injury was examined
- empirical data on a large non-clinical sample were presented
- adolescents using sex as self-injury were compared to adolescents using direct nonsuicidal self-injury
- there was a distinct association between penetrating sexual abuse, sexual risk-taking behaviors, trauma symptoms of dissociation, posttraumatic stress and sexual concerns and using sex as self-injury
