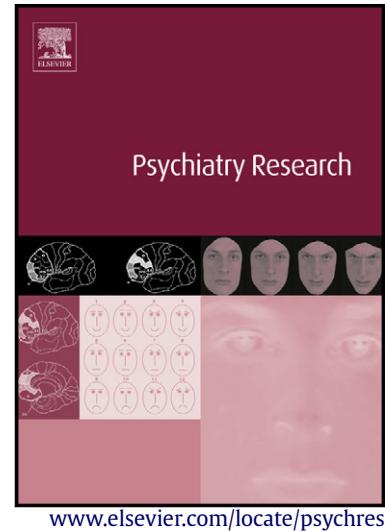


Prevalence and correlates of co-prescribing psychotropic medications with long-term opioid use nationally in the Veterans health administration
