

Abstract

Social anxiety disorder (SAD), which involves excessive anxiety and fear of

negative evaluation, is accompanied by abnormalities in brain function. While social

anxiety appears to be represented on a spectrum ranging from nonclinical behavior to

clinical manifestation, neural alteration in nonclinical populations remains unclear. This

study examined the relationship between psychological measures of social anxiety,

mainly using the Fear of Negative Evaluation Scale (FNES), and brain function
