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Effects of high versus low-quality preschool education: A longitudinal study in Mauritius

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Highlights:

- We used data from a randomized controlled experiment to compare high versus lowquality preschool education;
- On average, high-quality preschool (HQP) had no effect on test scores at age 11;
- HQP eliminated the effect of father's education level (a proxy for family income);
- HQP enhanced the effect of mother's education (the quality of the primary caregiver).



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
