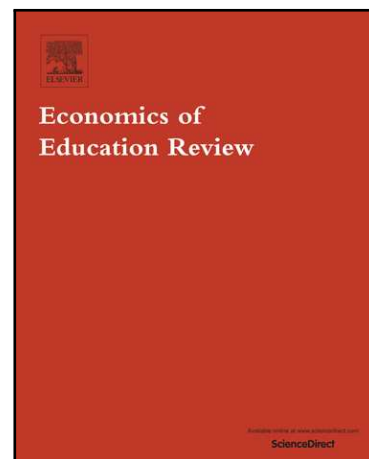


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Are States Winning the Fight? Evidence on the Impact of State Laws on Bullying in Schools

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Highlights:

- Student- and school-level policy evaluations exploit variation in timing and type of law adopted.
- Estimates based on data from large nationally representative surveys of students and principals.
- State laws may have little effect in high schools yet bullying occurs most often in middle schools.
- Estimated policy impacts vary across elementary, middle, high school student populations.
- Current challenges facing research on bullying are revealed.

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
