

Highlights

- This paper studies the causal effect of the age at migration.
- We apply a sibling fixed effects identification strategy using German data.
- We find significant negative age at migration effects on educational outcomes.
- The critical age of migration is not higher than 6 years, females respond stronger than males.
- Language skills cannot fully explain the causal effect.
