Highlights

- Humanitarian organizations are increasingly facilitating private sector supply chains.
- Agents in these multi-echelon supply chains might have different values.
- These organizations must understand their agents' values when designing supply chains.
- We suggest employing multi-criteria decision analysis to model and elicit agents' values.
- The method was successfully applied to a health supply chain in Uganda.
