Highlights

- Mission abort policy for systems working in random environment is considered.
- The mission is aborted when m-th shock occurs before time ξ since the mission start.
- A tradeoff between expected costs of system loss and uncompleted work is analyzed.
- Algorithm for optimal choice of the decision variables m and ξ is suggested.
