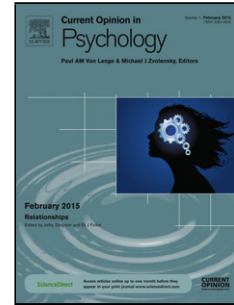

- Stress is associated with intimate partner aggression (IPA) perpetration.
- Stress interacts with individual vulnerabilities to increase IPA perpetration risk.
- A variety of situational and dispositional factors moderate the stress-IPA association.
