Highlights

- A test of the status quo as determinant of the prosociality of intuitive decisions
- Time pressure effects and response times are elicited
- Binary dictator game with either no, prosocial or selfish initial endowments
- The prosociality of the status quo is found to predict the response time patterns
- Status quo effects differ across deliberate and intuitive decisions
