Highlights

- We augment a standard allocation experiment to study the conflict between granting others
 the freedom to choose and restricting their choices to benefit environmental charity.
- We observe that most allocators force others to donate a positive, though low, amount.
- Unlimited freedom of choice is rejected by the majority of the participants.
