#### Highlights:

- Research has found a positive correlation between sexual frequency and happiness
- The causal connection between the two variables is unclear
- We assessed causation by randomly assigning some couples to increase their frequency of sex
- The manipulation did increase frequency, but decreased happiness and sexual enjoyment
