



ACCEPTED MANUSCRIPT

A large well stratified sample was achieved from the UK.

An extended TPB model in which there are two paths to behavior; one through intention and the other through habit.

Habit is an alternate path leading to transport use behaviors.

Environmental concern does not predict intention to use a particular transport mode. It does predict habit for car use.

PBC is more important in predicting public rather than private transport use.
