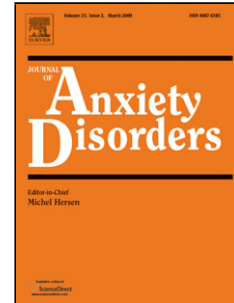

### Highlights:

- Difficulties in retrieval of positive memories relate to PTSD severity (etiology/maintenance).
- Positive-memory intervention may regulate affect/cognitions and enhance specific memory retrieval.
- Positive-memory intervention integration in trauma-focused treatments may augment benefits.
