Episodic and working memory function in Primary Progressive Aphasia: A meta-analysis

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Highlights:

- The distinction between the different Primary Progressive Aphasia (PPA) subtypes remains complex and challenging for clinicians.
- In addition to language impairments, memory deficits are observed in all PPA variants compared to healthy controls.
- Each PPA variant shows a different pattern of memory performance, with more pronounced episodic and working memory deficits in lv-PPA when compared to nv-PPA.
- Findings highlight the potential benefit of using memory tests in addition to language assessment to better differentiate between PPA variants.

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
