Highlights

- We examine the effects of women's political participation (WPP) on FLPR.
- We measure the women's political participation using the V-Dem WPE index.
- Both parametric and semi-parametric panel models are applied.
- WPP has a positive and statistically significant effect on FLPR.
- Our results also support the feminization U hypothesis.
