Highlights

- Apply new dual measures for skewness and dispersion based on conditional first moments in order to measure income inequality.
- Use the distribution of disposable incomes, provided by the EU-SILC database.
- Track the time evolution of income inequality, measured with the skewness and dispersion of the income distributions.
- Reveal major differences in inequality's evolution across European countries before and after the Global Financial Crisis.
